SEMI-ANNUAL FALL CLEAN UP SCHEDULED

Fall Clean-up is scheduled for **Saturday, October 4, 2008 from 8:00 AM to 12 noon.** Once again, as an added convenience to residents, the Township will also receive bulk items on **Friday, October 3, 2008 from 6:00 AM to 2:00 PM.**

This event is provided "**ONLY**" for residents as part of their trash collection service. This privilege is not transferable to anyone outside of the Township. The stub from your last trash bill is necessary as proof of residency.

A resident is permitted to bring **ONE** eight (8) foot pick-up truck- sized load, (NOT a loaded pick-up with a trailer full behind it) to the rear of the Township building on New

Valley Road for unloading into dumpsters. Four (4) car or passenger truck tires per residence are also permitted. **No tractor or equipment tires.** Refrigerators, freezers, and air conditioners must have the Freon removed.

NO hazardous materials are permitted such as: turpentine, paint thinners, paint strippers and removers, varnishes, paints, drain cleaners, swimming pool chemicals, weed killers, pesticides, fuel additives, gasoline, kerosene, anti-freeze & batteries.

These will **NOT** be accepted! Please separate larger bulk items such as washers, dryers, water heaters, etc, and place them so they are easily accessible to facilitate unloading of these items to a separate dumpster for scrap iron. *Thank You!*

What You Need to Know About the Broadcast DTV

By now you have no doubt heard a great deal about the broadcast digital transition on **February 19, 2009**. TV sets that currently receive programming through cable or another video service provider will not be affected by the federally-mandated switch. The reason America is switching to DTV is because digital is a more efficient way to broadcast, and it will free up the airwaves for other services, such as public safety communication.

However, if you have an older TV that relies on “over the air” broadcasting with an antenna (rabbit ears or rooftop) to receive a signal, you will be affected by the cutoff or analog broadcasts. Consumers will need to consider one of the following options:

- Purchase a digital-to-analog converter box that plugs into an existing television. The boxes, which cost between \$50-70 available for purchase in consumer electronic stores.

- Households can request up to two coupons from the federal government valued at \$40 each toward the purchase of a single set-top converter box.
- Subscribe to cable television or another video service provider
- Purchase a new television set with a built-in digital tuner

Any of these steps will ensure that “over the air” television consumers will continue to receive programming beyond the February 19, 2009 broadcast digital transition. ADDITIONAL INTERIM RECYCLING OPPORTUNITY

Beginning October 1, 2008

The monthly recycling held on the 4th Saturday of each month from 8:00 AM to 12 Noon will continue. However, with the assistance of grant monies from the County, Rye Township received two recycling containers that will be placed at the Township 24/7 for the convenience of its residents to drop off recyclables throughout the month. The items accepted at the recycling bins are as follows:

- **Aluminum Cans**—Rinsed and crushed. Foil is also accepted.
- **Bi-metal Cans**—Rinsed
- **Clear Glass** —Rinsed. Dispose of all caps and lids.
- **Plastic Jugs, Jars & Bottles (All #1 and #2)**
Rinsed, no caps or lids, and crushed if possible.
Separated as follows:
Opaque Milk , ice tea, and gallon water jugs (#2 HDPE), (please crush gallon containers)
Soda and small water bottles(#1 PETE)
Detergent bottles and White milk containers (#2 HDPE)
- **Cardboard**—**MUST** be broken down to fit into the bin compartment
- **Newspapers**—**MUST BE BUNDLED & TIED OR STACKED IN PAPER BAGS**



“UNACCEPTABLE”

- **Plastic tubs, deli containers, cups, trays and bags**
- **Styrofoam, bubble wrap**
- **Vinyl swimming pools**
- **Broken, sharp, jagged window glass, mirrors, ceramics, light bulbs**
- **Food soiled material**

1. **Call the Household Hazardous Wastes (HHW) Hotline 1-800-449-7587 to request a collection. The costs for Perry County residents is \$15.00 Payable to Curbside, Inc.**
2. **Assemble your Collection Kit. Your kit should arrive via UPS within a Few days. The kit can hold up to 75 pounds.**
3. **Place your Collection Kit out for pick-up. Place the kit near your garage or porch by 8:00 AM on the prearranged collection date. That's it. You do not even need to be home.**
