BULK FALL CLEAN UP SCHEDULED

The second drop –off event is scheduled for **Friday, Oct. 5 from 6:00 AM to 1:45 PM and Saturday, Oct. 6 from 8 AM to 12 noon** in the rear lot at the Township building. ***This service is ONLY provided to residents.*** Each residence is permitted to bring one pick up truck-sized load. Four (4) passenger or small truck tires per household are permitted. Hazardous materials are not permitted such as: paint products, turpentine, or paint thinners; automotive products such as brake fluid, anti-freeze, oil, gasoline; lawn/garden pesticides, or batteries. No asbestos shingles, treated lumber, or pool chemicals. All larger refrigerators or freezers must have the Freon and the doors removed. Examples of items that may be dropped off are old furniture, bedding, carpeting, & appliances. Residents are asked to consider donating usable items to local charities.

SEPARATING ITEMS

In compliance with Act 108, all electronic devices: televisions, computers, monitors, printers, laptops, cell phones, and copiers must be separated from your load for placement in a separate dumpster.

Please separate larger bulk items such as washers, dryers, water heaters, refrigerators and place them so they are easily accessible to facilitate unloading of these items into a separate dumpster for scrap metal.

A copy of your last trash bill is required for proof of residency. If that is not available, bring along your current PA driver’s license, or other photo I.D. and tax bill showing a current address.

WEST NILE VIRUS

The West Nile Virus is a form of encephalitis carried by birds. Mosquitoes become infected when they bite the birds and subsequently transmit the virus to humans. By minimizing areas of standing water you can reduce the areas where mosquitoes can breed. Please discard water holding containers, clean clogged roof gutters, empty & refill birdbaths, & cover children’s pools. Visit the website www.westnile.state.pa.us or more information.

Why Prepare Now for Emergencies?

NOW is the time to prepare for emergencies! Emergency workers will help after a disaster strikes, but they may not be able to reach everyone right away. That’s why it is so important to be ready to survive on your own for at least three (3) days during an emergency. We can’t control natural disasters, emergencies, or terrorist attacks, but we can be ready for them and know what to do to take care of ourselves and our loved ones. Find out more at www.readypa.org.

As a result of the tornado that hit the Township last year, Rye Township has implemented additional preparedness measures for power outages and other emergencies. Emergency generators have been purchased and installed at the Township building and the Glenvale Church, the Township’s designated community evacuation center.

If there is an extended power outage that disrupts normal activity, the Township building will open as the Emergency Operations Center and the Glenvale Church will be opened to receive community residents who cannot stay in their homes. If there is an emergency, call the Township building or other emergency contacts to see if the shelter is open.

If the power goes out listen to a battery-operated radio or car radio for emergency information. WHP 580 is the designated Emergency Broadcast radio station. You may also still be able to use your old style corded phone during a power outage, since the phone line carries enough power to operate these older phones. Modern wireless phones will not work without separate power, so keep an old style corded phone on hand to plug in for emergencies.

We ask all Rye Township residents to look after their neighbors during severe weather or power loss emergencies —particularly the elderly and others that might have difficulty coping with these conditions. If you know of anyone who might need special assistance in an emergency, please contact the Township office at (717) 957-2348. A listing of residents with special needs is included as part of the Township Emergency Operations Manual.

VOTER ID REQUIRED FOR 2012 ELECTION



All voters will be required to show photo I.D. at the polling place, which is the Rye Township municipal building, before voting in the General Election on **November 6, 2012 from 7 AM to 8 PM** in Rye Township. In summary, acceptable

forms of photo ID include: an ID issued by the U.S. Government (valid U.S. passport, unexpired U.S. Military ID), current PA driver's license, non-driver's license photo ID (current employee photo ID issued by Federal, Pennsylvania, County or Municipal Government; current photo ID card from a public or private Pennsylvania College or University; or a current photo issued by a PA Car Facility. Please contact the Perry County Courthouse at 717-582-2131 and ask to speak with Voter Registration if you have any questions about this requirement.

WOOD CHIPS AVAILABLE FOR PICK UP

Brush dropped off at the Township building from Rye Township residents is recycled into wood chips that are available free of charge to Rye Township residents. Chips may be picked up Monday through Friday 6 AM to 2 PM. PENN WASTE CONTRACT

Rye Township recently opted to extend the current two year contract with Penn Waste for weekly trash collection services. The quarterly cost for collection will remain the same for 2013 at \$50.00 per quarter for 4 bags, (40 lbs. weight limit each) or two cans (50 lbs weight limit each). All trash must be bagged even if placed out for collection within cans.

Residents are reminded that plastics, glass, newspapers, aluminum, office paper, envelopes, tin, magazines, & cardboard are recyclable materials at our drop off recycling center located in the gravel parking lot beside the municipal building at 1775 New Valley Road. Recycling dumpsters are provided for residents only, because the Township funds the program. Interstate Waste charges \$230.00 per round trip for hauling & disposal of recyclables when a container is full. *Thank you for recycling!*
