

**RYE TOWNSHIP  
SUPERVISORS' MEETING  
May 21, 2018**

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**PRESENT:** Chairman Ken Quigley, Supervisor John F. Stahl, Daisy Lightner, Secretary/  
Treasurer, Sean Fedder, Nancy Sunday, John W. Smith and Jessica Bacon.

**EXCUSED:** Vice-Chairman Jim Sabo

**FORMER SUPERVISOR PRESENT:** Robert Lightner

The meeting was held at the municipal building and called to order at 7:00 PM.  
Chairman Quigley convened the meeting with the pledge of allegiance to the flag.

Chairman Quigley announced that the Board held an Executive Session at 6:05 PM to discuss updates to the Pension Plans. Most of the updates are mandatory imposed by Pennsylvania Municipal Retirement System (PMRS) and the Internal Revenue Service. However, the Board plans to also adopt Ordinances to revise all future plans to a Defined Contribution Plan or a Cash Balance plan instead of the current Defined Benefit Plan.

**CITIZEN PARTICIPATION:** Chairman Quigley welcomed everyone and asked if there was any citizen participation at this time. No response was received.

**APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES:** Chairman Quigley made a motion and Supervisor Stahl seconded to approve the minutes of the April 23, 2018 supervisors' meeting as submitted. Motion carried.

**MONTHLY MUNICIPAL REPORTS:** Zoning Officer Lenny Sizer provided a May Zoning Report as follows: Two (2) Permits Issued; One (1) Certificate of Use for new home at 3217 Valley Road; numerous calls and emails, and follow up on zoning violations for a total due in fees of \$536.25. The report was placed on the front table for public review.

A Sewage Enforcement Report was submitted by SEO Lenny Sizer of Frederick Seibert Associates listing five (5) activities for May, including alternate site testing for the vacant lot at 85 Idle Road; three (3) cover inspections for a total due of \$730.00.

The Road Report was provided by Road Superintendent, Ken Quigley. The road crew was busy with Spring Bulk Clean-up; delivering tires collected to Mahantango's in Liverpool, installed a drain box on Dutch Cemetery Road; patching pot holes, set up and tear down for Election Day, and chipping brush and cleaning up trees and limbs from the recent wind storm that blew through the area causing damage with many downed trees and power outages.

Nancy Sunday of the Recreation Board was present and provided the following update for upcoming events:

No Emergency Management Report was presented.

The April Treasurer's Report & General & Solid Waste Fund Balance Reports were submitted for review by the Secretary/Treasurer & placed on the front table for review. The reports are submitted and approved by the Board pending the 2018 Financial Audit.

**RESOLUTION:** Chairman Quigley made a motion with a second from Supervisor Stahl to adopt **Resolution 18-16**, which authorizes the Secretary/Treasurer to take an early withdrawal of a 60 month Future Land Purchase Certificate at the Bank of Landisburg, earning 1.20% interest, accepting the nine month early withdrawal penalty and transfer it to a 35 month Certificate at the same bank earning 2.40% or double the amount. The penalty will be recovered within one year and earn an additional \$1,200 in interest by the end of 2019. Motion carried unanimously.

**ORDINANCE:** Ordinance 18-01 was advertised and proof of publication is on file. Chairman Quigley made a motion and Supervisor Sabo seconded to **adopt Ordinance 18-01**, which authorizes the closing of Grier Point Road on Saturday, June 9, 2018 from 9:00 AM to approximately 8:00 PM for the Bethel United Methodist Church to hold a strawberry/bluegrass festival. Motion carried.

**NEW BUSINESS:** Supervisor Sabo made a motion with a second from Supervisor Stahl to appoint Dana Graupensperger to fill a vacancy on the Recreation Board for a partial five (5) year term ending December 31, 2022. Motion carried unanimously.

Chairman Quigley made a motion with a second from Supervisor Stahl to accept the resignation of John Schulze as Driveway Permit Officer effective immediately. Motion carried unanimously.

Chairman Quigley made a motion with a second from Supervisor Stahl to appoint Ray Martin as the Driveway Permit Officer effective as soon as he takes his Oath of Office. Motion carried unanimously.

Chairman Quigley made a motion with a second from Supervisor Stahl to appoint John Schulze as the Assistant Driveway Permit Officer as a consultant and to assist with the newly appointed Driveway Permit Officer. Motion carried unanimously.

Chairman Quigley announced the following:

- ◆ The office will be closed for Memorial Day on May 28, 2018 with trash collection rescheduled to Wednesday, May 30.
- ◆ June 3 – Strawberry Festival- Free event; 6:00 PM to 7:00 PM at the New Valley Road Park; held rain or shine.
- ◆ June 30 - Annual Fishing Derby rescheduled; 9 AM to 10:30 AM; rain date July 1; 1-2:30 PM at the Marysville Sportsmen's Association in Marysville Borough; Ages 3-15 years old; hotdogs and snacks will be provided.

**APPROVAL AND PAYMENT OF THE BILLS:** The Secretary/Treasurer provided a May expense check register and submitted the following checks for approval and payment: General Fund Check's #s 15951-15975 in the amount of \$9,472.66.

Payroll checks #s 7392--7401 in the amount of \$4,291.06. No payroll checks void.

Payroll checks #s 7402-7408 in the amount of \$4,199.97. No payroll checks void.

With no further discussion on the bills presented, Supervisor Stahl made a motion and Chairman Quigley seconded to approve all the expense checks and payroll checks presented for payment. Motion carried unanimously.

**CITIZEN PARTICIPATION:** Chairman Quigley asked if there was any citizen participation.

John Smith of Cove Road asked who should be contacted during an emergency when trees fall down and involve electric lines. John said there were several trees down on Cove Road from the recent wind storm.

Chairman Quigley offered that the local road crew does not get involved with downed trees when electric lines are involved. Residents should contact Perry County Dispatch non-emergency number at 1-888-372-8947. The County will then dispatch the local fire company and contact PP & L.

Chairman Quigley provided updates to several recent zoning violations.

**ADJOURNMENT OF THE MEETING:** With no further discussion or business before the Board, Chairman Quigley made a motion with a second from Supervisor Stahl to adjourn the meeting at 7:28 PM. Motion carried.
