**BULK FALL CLEAN UP SCHEDULED**

The second drop-off event is scheduled for **Friday, Oct. 4 from 6:00 AM to 1:45 PM** and **Saturday, Oct. 5 from 8 AM to 12 noon** in the rear lot at the Township building. ***This service is ONLY provided to residents.*** Each residence is permitted to bring one pick up truck-sized load. Four (4) passenger or small truck tires per household are permitted. Hazardous materials are ***not*** permitted such as: paint products, turpentine, or paint thinners; automotive products such as brake fluid, anti-freeze, oil, gasoline; lawn/garden pesticides, or batteries. No asbestos shingles, treated lumber, or pool chemicals. All larger refrigerators or freezers **must** have the Freon and the doors removed. Examples of items that may be dropped off are old furniture, bedding, carpeting, & appliances. Residents are asked to consider donating usable items to local charities.

**SEPARATING ITEMS**

In compliance with Act 108, all electronic devices: televisions, computers, monitors, printers, laptops, cell phones, and copiers **must** be separated from your load for placement in a separate dumpster.

Please separate larger bulk items such as washers, dryers, water heaters, refrigerators and place them so they are easily accessible to facilitate unloading of these items into a separate dumpster for scrap metal.

**A copy of your last trash bill is required for proof of residency. If that is not available, bring along your current PA driver's license, or other photo I.D. and/or tax bill showing a current address.**

### "THANK YOU FOR RECYCLING"

Rye Township's single-stream drop off recycling program, putting all your recyclables together into the recycling bin, makes it easier than ever to recycle. No need to tie or bundle newspaper or magazines. We only ask that you separate and break down corrugated cardboard so it can be placed in a separate recycling bin made especially to transport cardboard.

The bins are located in the gravel parking area beside the Township building at 1775 New Valley Road. We also accept aluminum food & beverage containers, including aluminum foil and pie/baking tins. Glass food and beverage containers: Clear, brown, green glass; Plastic containers such as milk bottles, water bottles, detergent

bottles, soda bottles, shampoo bottles, bleach bottles etc. Steel or tin cans; Paper, cardboard boxes (cereal, rice/pasta boxes; shoe boxes etc.), junk mail, magazines, & phone books.



Every year Americans use enormous amounts of paper, equivalent to a 100 foot tall tree per person according to the US Environmental Protection Agency. The Township office does its part to shred & recycle all of its office paper and envelopes. Recycling paper saves trees, saves water because making paper from trees requires more water, and reduces the amount of clutter in landfills. Recycling 1 ton of paper conserves 3.3 cubic yards of landfill space. *Your efforts DO make a difference!* ♦

### PINE HILL ROAD BRIDGE REPLACEMENT

The Board of Supervisors was awarded funding from the Commonwealth of PA to offset costs to replace the bridge on Pine Hill Road over Fishing Run split 80% from the State & 20% municipal. Wilson Consulting is the engineer for the project. The existing bridge, deemed structurally deficient, is a single span steel I-beam type with a span of 18 feet. The proposed bridge will be a precast concrete box culvert with pre-cast end sections to minimize construction duration with a span of 20 feet. The new bridge will not be posted with any weight restrictions and will permit the passage of larger, heavier trucks and their loads.



Replacement of Pine Hill Road bridge is scheduled tentatively for June 2014.

The project will be bid in early spring with construction tentatively scheduled for early June after school dismisses to avoid conflict with school bus routes. Pine Hill Road will be closed for approximately 8-10 weeks. Depending on weather and other variables, the Board is hoping to reopen Pine Hill Road by the end of August 2014. More details in 2014.
