

New Septic System -

Ecoflo Peat Filter

The Ecoflo peat filter is one of several kinds of effluent filters that are now available as components of an on-lot sewage disposal system. Ecoflo can be a valuable tool for replacement of an existing failed sewage system. If site and/or soil conditions do not allow for a more conventional solution to the problem (e.g. small lot, not enough of room, steep slopes, poor soils) a peat filter may enable the replacement system to function adequately.

For new construction, a peat filter can reduce the size of the mound absorption area, but not replace it. Generally, the cost will be greater for a system with the Ecoflo than for one without it, plus the peat will have to be replaced after eight years. If aesthetics are more important than price (i.e.: you are willing to pay extra for a smaller mound), than the Ecoflo may be warranted. 2006 ROAD BIDS ACCEPTED

At the May 8th special meeting the Township Supervisors awarded road resurfacing bids to Wilson Paving, Inc. of Carlisle at a cost of \$115,200 for FB2 Wearing Course work to be placed on approximately 1½ miles of roadway. Roads scheduled for 2" of resurfacing are as follows:

- **A portion of Lambs Gap Road**
- **Old Mill Road**
- **Grier Point Road and;**
- **A portion of Idle Road.**
