SPRING BULK CLEAN-UP SCHEDULED

The Annual Bulk Clean-Up event is scheduled for Friday, May 3 from 6:00 AM to 1:45 PM and Saturday, May 4 from 8 AM to 12 noon in the rear lot at the Township building. Held Rain or Shine. This service is provided ONLY for you as a resident and only for your items. Each residence is permitted to bring One (1) pick-up truck-sized load. A pick-up load, plus a trailer, will not be permitted and will be turned away. If you are a landlord and are bringing in a load for your rental property, the occupant is not permitted to also participate.


<u>Eligibility requirements for participation</u>. Upon entering the yard area, each resident will be asked to provide the attendant a copy of their last quarterly garbage bill as proof of residency. If that is not available, bring a current PA photo driver's license and/or a tax bill showing your current address. As this bulk clean-up event is funded by trash fees, residents whose refuse collection accounts are severely delinquent, will not be permitted to participate. Assistance with unloading is provided for the elderly & disabled.

<u>Permitted items</u>. Four **(4)** passenger or <u>smaller</u> truck tires per refuse account are permitted. Old house and patio furniture, bedding, carpeting, fixtures, appliances, including microwaves, washers, dryers, water heaters, refrigerators, freezers, stoves, and dishwashers. All larger refrigerators or freezers <u>must</u> have the Freon and the doors removed. Please separate larger bulk items such as washers, dryers, water heaters, refrigerators, freezers, dishwashers, stoves and place them so they are easily accessible to facilitate unloading into a separate dumpster for scrap metal.

Non-Permissible items. Hazardous materials are **NOT** permitted such as: paint products, turpentine, paint thinners; automotive products such as brake fluid, antifreeze, oil, gasoline; lawn/garden pesticides, or batteries. **NO ELECTRONICS**, asbestos shingles, propane cylinders, or pool or lawn chemicals.

NO brush for chipping and NO Cardboard Recycling will be accepted the week before, during, or the week of May 6th following the clean-up event.

More Men are Secking Homes in the Town.

The contemplated improvements in and about Marysville, which includes the proposed new bridge, has caused a big boom in that town. There is not an idle man in town, as the contractor having charge of the erection of the spans on that side of the river has hired every man available and is offering good wages. The latter has been an inducement for many to resign their positions with the Northern Central Railroad Company and has resulted in decreasing the work train crew from 40 to 25. The farmers are worrying about help for the summer and say they will be obliged to pay big prices. A large number of men from Buffalo and Liverpool who have been engaged in the boating business have located in Marysville and secured employment with the bridge contractors. On Monday next the first lot of foreigners are expected.

NOTICE! CHANGES IN BILLING FOR GARBAGE BILLS

Effective April 1, 2024, due to a change in billing agencies, payment for trash collection service will no longer be accepted by Keystone Collections Group.

The Board approved an Agreement with Pennsylvania Municipal Services Co. known as PAMS to handle regular and delinquent trash billing and payments.

PAMS was established in 1954 and is one of the oldest fee and tax administrators in the State. Residents can pay their bill easy and efficiently online or by mail. PAMS provides the following payment options:

◆ ACH electronic check (\$0.40 convenience fee)

Credit/debit card (\$6.00 convenience fee)

♦ Eliminate paper invoices and receive your bill by email

♦ Sign up for Auto-pay (automatic deduction on the bill due date)

◆ Pay your bill by mail. A return envelope will be included.

ORDINANCE REMINDERS

It's that time of year when calls are received regarding loose or barking dogs, junk accumulating in yards, or unkept, not mowed yards. Here are a few reminders of these Ordinances, which are found in their entirety on the Township website:

Section 243-2. Nuisance. Declared illegal or Prohibited.
Storing or accumulating, garbage, rubbish, or junk material.
Section 337-3. Vector. Prohibited Acts. Accumulating abandoned automobiles, trucks, tractors or machinery. Permitting invasive weeds or lawns to grow to more than 8 inches high in any lot or yard. This does not include Agricultural/farm fields.
Section 110-3. Dogs. Running at large; noise disturbances.
Dogs are not permitted to run at large upon streets, parks or any public or private property without the consent of the owner.
Dogs are not permitted to make any loud noise or disturbance, which shall interfere with the peace, quiet, & rest of the public.

DO I NEED A ZONING PERMIT?

As a general rule, building and zoning permits are required for any construction which changes the outside dimensions of an existing structure or adds a new structure including, but not limited to:

- Pools, both above and inground with a depth over 24" or 2 feet
- New homes
 Decks
 Spas and hot tubs
 Additions
- Porch & Porch enclosures
 Garages Attached and Accessory
- Sheds Pole Buildings Carports Signs In-home business
- Solar panel installation
 Retaining walls four (4) feet or over
- Keeping of domesticated chickens within Residential Districts.



A maximum limit of SIX chickens is permitted on a residentially zoned property. Roosters are prohibited.
