## SPRING BULK CLEAN-UP SCHEDULED

The Annual Bulk Clean-Up event is scheduled for **Friday, May 1 from 6:00 AM to 1:45 PM and Saturday, May 2 from 8 AM to 12 noon** in the rear lot at the Township building. **HELD RAIN OR SHINE. This service is provided ONLY for you as a resident and only for your items.** Each residence is permitted to bring **One (1) pick-up truck-sized load.** A pick-up load, plus a trailer, will not be permitted and will be turned away. If you are a landlord and are bringing in a load for your rental property, the occupant is not permitted to also participate.

**Eligibility requirements for participation.** Upon entering the yard area, each resident will be asked to provide the attendant a copy of their last quarterly garbage bill as proof of residency. If that is not available, bring a current PA photo driver's license and/or a tax bill showing your current address. As this bulk clean-up event is funded by trash fees, residents whose refuse collection accounts are severely delinquent, will not be permitted to participate. Assistance with unloading is provided for the elderly & disabled.

**Permitted items.** Four (4) passenger or smaller truck tires per refuse account are permitted. Old house and patio furniture, bedding, (mattresses), carpeting, fixtures, appliances, including microwaves, washers, dryers, water heaters, refrigerators, freezers, stoves, and dishwashers. All larger refrigerators or freezers must have the Freon and the doors removed. Please separate larger bulk items such as washers, dryers, water heaters, refrigerators, freezers, dishwashers, stoves and place them so they are easily accessible to facilitate unloading into a separate dumpster for scrap metal.

**Non-Permissible items.** Hazardous materials are **NOT** permitted such as: paint products, turpentine, paint thinners; automotive products such as brake fluid, antifreeze, oil, gasoline; lawn/garden pesticides, or batteries. **NO ELECTRONICS**, asbestos shingles, propane cylinders, or pool or lawn chemicals.

**NO brush for chipping and NO Cardboard Recycling** will be accepted the week before, during, or the week of May 4th following the clean-up event. ♦

is your dog licensed?



Beginning in 2024 all dogs must be licensed when 8 weeks and older:

- Dog must be licensed each January 1st
- Unlicensed and/or uncontrolled dog can cause

owner to receive a significant fine.

- A dog licensed for a non-senior citizen is \$10.80, there is not a spay or neuter discount
- A dog licensed for a senior (age 65) or disabled citizen is \$8.80, there is no spay or neuter discount
- Please keep your license certificate for your records & receipt.

## MARYSVILLE RYE HISTORICAL SOCIETY

**AMERICA 250** The Marysville Rye Historical Society is planning an historical "dig" and restoration project of the Ogle Cemetery in Cove to celebrate the 250th Anniversary of the signing of The Declaration of Independence. William Ogle was awarded 500 acres in 1787 for his participation in the Revolutionary War. Cove was part of Rye Township, Cumberland County at the time. William's son, John Ogle, owned one of the oldest farms in Rye Township. The first school room was held in the second floor of his spring house in 1835 with John Humes being the school master. Both William (deceased 1806) and John (deceased 1824) are buried in the Ogle Cemetery along with numerous other family members. The Cemetery was decimated in 1975.



Along with the restoration project, we are planning several other activities to commemorate this historic date. Please feel free to join us at the Marysville Rye Library at 5:30 on **March 24th, April 21st, May 19th, and June 16th** as we plan to celebrate 250 years of America The Beautiful! ## HEISLEY ROAD CULVERT REPAIR

In August of 2024, Hurricane Debby hit Rye Township and the excess water flow damage a portion of Heisley Road causing the need for culvert replacement. Heisley Road has been one lane over the culvert since August of 2024. Senator Greg Rothman has advocated for State funds to help offset the cost of the replacement culvert. The cost of the project is expected to be over \$277,000. Preliminary work for the permitting was done in 2025 and the permit application was submitted to DEP in February of 2026. We are hopeful that the permit will be issued later this year and the repairs can be completed quickly.





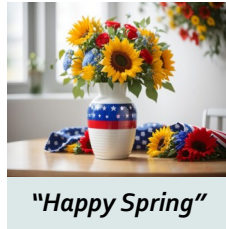

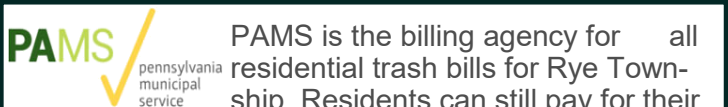
**S.T.O.P.**

While the law is easy to understand, the tougher thing to figure out is why so many motorists go through stop signs illegally. So why is it so many fail to stop at stop signs? Perhaps some people are in too big of a hurry. It seems that many do not want to wait very long for anything these days, including going through a stop sign. It is time to re-emphasize that driving is a serious activity that requires a driver's complete attention. Look left, look right, and then look left again. Spell out S.T.O.P. in your head before you proceed into any intersection.



Please obey the stop sign and come to a complete stop at all stop signs. Don't proceed into the intersection until you're certain it is safe.
